Dr. Hamdullah Mohib has served as Afghanistan's Ambassador to the United States since September 2015, and is also non-resident Ambassador to Mexico, the Dominican Republic, Argentina, and Columbia. Ambassador Mohib has focused on redefining Afghanistan's narrative in the United States to reflect its new realities as a young democracy moving steadily on a path to prosperity and peace as a result 16 years of social change and institutional development. He has worked to highlight the critical yet under-credited role of cultural and peace initiatives, women, and youth in re-creating Afghanistan. Previously, he served as Deputy Chief of Staff to H.E. The President of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, where he led the presidential negotiating team for the formulation of Afghanistan's national development "Realizing Self-Reliance" reform strategy. Dr. Mohib has a PhD and Bachelor's degree with honors from Brunel University in the United Kingdom, and is a published expert on Afghan politics.
